Seasons for Growth Program



Seasons for Growth is an innovative grief and loss education program that uses the imagery of the seasons to illustrate the experience of grief. It aims to strengthen the social; and emotional wellbeing of children and young people (aged 6-18) who are dealing with significant life changes by:

- exploring the impact of change and loss on every-day life
- learning new ways to respond to these changes
- Loss and grief can occur as the result of the loss a loved one, separation, divorce, impacts of illness, disability, moving schools/house and losing friends, the loss of a pet, etc.
- Seasons for Growth enables young people to learn that they are not alone in dealing with the effects of change, loss and grief and build their communication, decision making and problem solving skills within a supportive peer group.
- Trained adult 'Companions' facilitate the small group program, where participants support and learn from each other in age appropriate and engaging activities
- Children, young people, and adult programs are available at intervals throughout the Newcastle Hunter Region.

Please note there is also a Seasons for Growth Parenting Program available which assists parents in supporting their child following separation and divorce.

- Research shows clear links that exposure to ultraviolet rays as a child predisposes to developing eye diseases including: cataracts, macular degeneration, pterygium, photo keratitis and skin cancer of the eyelid and eye area.
- School Shades will block 99% of ultraviolet rays to children's eyes
